Reaching New Areas

It's a new chapter in Colombia's story. In a recent interview with the Colombia Assemblies of God General Superintendent Humberto Fajardo, he spoke about plans in place to open 1,000 new churches in the next three



years (largely in rural areas that were previously inaccessible due to violence) and to train 20,000 leaders to staff the new plants. Our part in this plan is to train the leaders who will work with children, through our Children's Ministry Coordinators class and King's Castle evangelism teams.

This month we took our King's Castle team to a small town where one of these new churches is being planted called Hoyorico. Right now they meet in a house every Saturday afternoon. We teamed up with a brand new King's Castle team from the next nearest city to help them launch their first

In June our friend Aaron came to visit us. Eighteen years ago Aaron was one of our youth in Atlanta when we were serving as leaders at Calvary Assembly of God. Today he is a missionary in Guatemala working with the homeless population. He is extremely experienced in working with men who are addicted to alcohol, drugs and sniffing glue. It just so happened, while we were out doing an evangelism program with the King's Castle

team near our local church, that a man who was clearly drunk began to interrupt the program. While we have run into this situation a few times out on the streets, this was the first time that the person was disrupting everything we were trying to do. We began to feel nervous and thought about shutting down the program on the spot, but God had a



plan in having Aaron with specifically for that day. Aaron went and talked to the man, engaged him in conversation and used the opportunity to minister to him while we continued the program for the children. He was the perfect person to be with us to help control the situation. We're so proud of Aaron and the incredible work he is doing in Guatemala.
